**Notes**

- Colours are based on groups of the original recommendation categories. The groups reflect Council's new public land use categories - see Chapter 10.
- Recommendations are the result of 11 past LCC investigations - refer to list in Chapter 10.
- Wildlife reserves are shown as either nature conservation reserves or natural features reserves. In accordance with the Department of Natural Resources and Environment's proposed classification of January 1996.
- Areas previously recommended for fuelwood production, eucalyptus oil production or as uncommitted land are colored as for State Forest, but are separately labeled.
- The Goulburn River from Seymour to the Murrumbidgee, and the Ovens River downstream from Wangaratta, are heritage rivers.
- All recommendations are shown as approved by government, including the recently legislated Chiltern-Brownish National Park.
- Small areas are not able to be shown at this scale, for example highway parks, roadside conservation areas and utility easements.
- Crown land in several townships that were cities, rural cities, towns or boroughs at the time of previous LCC investigations is not subject to recommendations. That land, and other township land, is shown as uncategorised public land.

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
