Notes:

1. The recommendation categories are identified by letters which refer to final recommendations of the Land Conservation Council. Letters for each category are those most commonly used by Council.
2. Individual recommendations are not shown. Different categories with the same letter and colour are differentiated on the 1:500 000 public land use maps of Victoria in the Council's Statewide Assessment report, and on the 1:250 000 maps in each published set of recommendations.
3. Recommendations shown are those of the most recent investigation, review or special investigation by Council. They are shown as recommended, or as accepted by the Government, and include some variations. Other Government land use decisions are also shown, for example Point Nepean National Park.
4. Many small areas in numerous categories cannot be shown at this scale. Several recommendation categories are not shown as all their occurrences are small. These are streamside reserves, highway parks, roadside conservation, geological reserves, scenic coasts, township land (commonly T), and transmission lines. Military training (V) is a descriptive category and is not shown.
5. Marine and wildlife reserves include marine reserves; wildlife reserves include wildlife management co-operative areas; State forest includes forest area; softwood production includes some areas where Government decisions have been deferred; natural features and scenic reserves include cave reserves; agriculture includes areas for alienation, land exchange, research, commons, licensure and leasehold; utilities include hydroelectricity production; and other reserves and public land include areas for revegetation.
6. The Council's Final Recommendations for the Mallee Area Review are shown, but only large blocks are able to be shown at this scale.
